

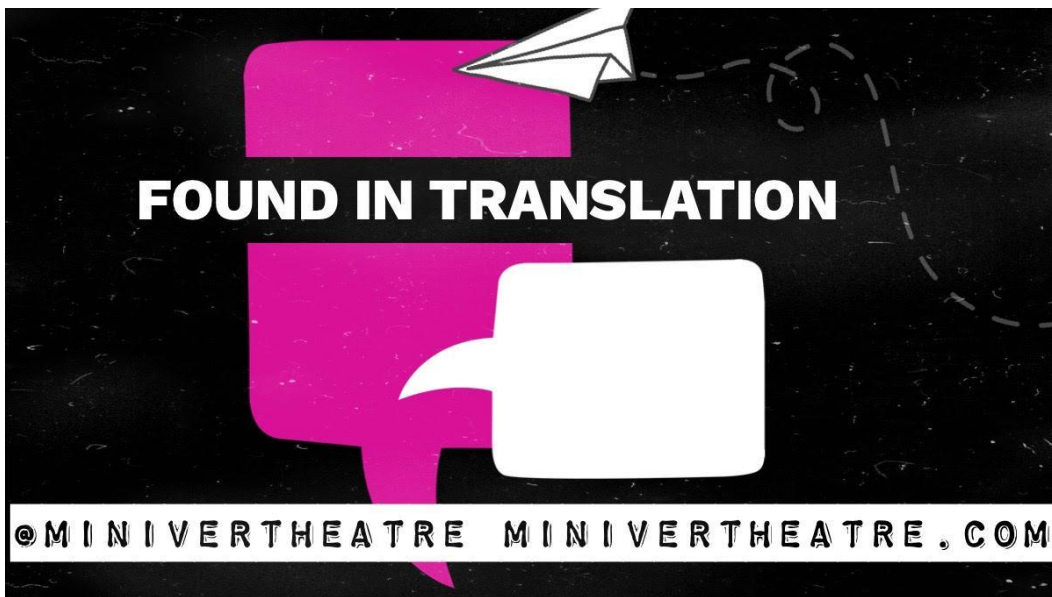


### Inclusive Live Comedy Comes to the Arcola

***Found in Translation*** is an inclusive and **accessible stand-up comedy night** for d/Deaf, deafened and hard of hearing people starting at **7pm** on the **8th of November** at the **Arcola Theatre** in **London** as part of the *Today I'm Wiser Festival*.

This evening of comedy showcases **talented performers** who come from **different backgrounds** and each have their own story to share. Amongst those performing, there are internationally renowned Deaf comedians **Rinkoo Barpaga** and **Gavin Lilley**. The performances will be interpreted in both **BSL** and **spoken English**. Enabling those with hearing loss to either take to the stage or take their place in the audience, this new comedy night by **Miniver Theatre** is about what can be achieved, enjoyed and Found in Translation.
